Fifth Mr Willis Dinner Sunday, 9th September






1. I had a good time. I learnt not to eat too much candy and brush

Chairman's Report by Warren Kinne

Never was a good work done without much trouble" 好事多磨

A long time ago I read something from Victor Turner, a cultural anthropologist, along the lines of structure vs. anti-structure.

You Dao stems from a good idea and the desire to make that idea work in a practical way. The idea was a hope to accompany migrant people in their struggle to better themselves and their families. In order to do that practically we needed to set up an organization – a structure that would facilitate our efforts. Now we have people in the field, a Board with its Chairman, registration and auditing, a logo, proposals and projects. We are still probably new enough and small enough to not yet suffer from too

dire an ossification of the structures that originally helped along our vision. However these structures could come to miss the mark over time. Still, we must always be open to the possibility that some "prophetic" challenge could arise calling for a restructuring, without being tied to the inertia of our original structure, which, after all, grew from a wee movement aimed at helping a specific group.

I am old enough to know that structures can become moribund and need change. At the same time we humans need structures if we are to get things done. This applies to health delivery services, legal systems, sporting associations, clubs, poetry nights ... and to NGOs as well.

There is the constant need to organize and to dismantle. Where are we in the cycle?



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
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The Project Administrators have monthly home visits to the scholarship families and make appropriate referrals if needed.
